

## **Day 4 - October 27, 2022**

**AT A GLANCE:** What sessions took place today?

Day 4 of GGGWeek consisted of 7 knowledge sharing sessions focusing on a wide range of topics. Most of those categories were already explored in the past days, so today we focused our attention on a very important **Crosscutting Theme: Gender Just Interventions for Transformative Climate Action**. “Just Transitions” is on the climate agenda with the Just Transition Declaration agreed at COP26 and other initiatives, including the development of Just Transitions Financial Roadmaps in some countries. At the same time, gender is often left inexplicit in the concept of Just Transitions and requisite financing continues to be lacking. This leads to increased gaps in going from ambition to tangible outcomes at impact. In response to this, the Green Growth Knowledge Partnership (GGKP) Gender Expert Group (GEG) aims to identify and close the gaps in achieving transformative outcomes at scale. In this session, members of the GGKP GEG discussed the barriers and obstacles preventing us from moving beyond “gender at entry” to real impacts on the ground. The session discussed the models and tools that work, as well as what further needs to be done, to create an enabling environment for more just and inclusive outcomes.

On this day, the **11<sup>th</sup> Assembly and the 15<sup>th</sup> Council** took place in GGGI headquarters in Seoul, South Korea. The Assembly, the supreme organ of the GGGI, is composed of all GGGI Members. The Council, the executive organ of the GGGI, consists of no more than seventeen members. On day 4, the supreme and executive organs convened in the joint meeting Assembly and Council that was hosted by the current President and Chair of the Council, Mr. Ban Ki-moon. In his opening remarks, Mr. Ban Ki-moon was pleased to see so many people in the room and welcomed them as well as those joining the Assembly and Council online. After reflecting on the challenges that Covid-19 posed for the entire world, Mr. Ban Ki-moon stated:

*“I remind you that challenges come with opportunities. Last year I was very pleased to see how GGGI seized those opportunities to help its members to heal and managed to make very significant progress despite the past challenges. Let us work together for the challenges that the world has put in front of us”.*

After the initial remarks, the 11<sup>th</sup> Assembly and 15<sup>th</sup> Council the Delegates and Excellencies engaged in discussions on the best ways to move forward and renewed their commitments to the goals and mission of GGGI.
